STRONG: Driver License or Identification (non-driver) Card (Standard, REAL ID, Enhanced)

The purpose of the driver license is to certify that the owner of that license has proven that he/she is capable of operating a motor vehicle on public roads in a safe and responsible manner. Below are examples of New York State's cards. HEALTHELINK will accept other U.S. States as well as other countries' cards.

STRONG: Employment Authorization Document with photograph (Form I-766)

The Form I-766 employment authorization document or EAD card, known popularly as a work permit, is a document issued by the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) that provides temporary employment authorization to noncitizens in the United States.





STRONG: Foreign Passport with I-551 stamp

The United States Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) uses either an I-551 stamp or a temporary I-551 printed notation on a machine-readable immigrant visa (MRIV) to indicate temporary evidence of lawful permanent residence.

STRONG: Global Entry

Global Entry is a U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) program that allows expedited clearance for pre-approved, low-risk travelers upon arrival in the United States. Members enter the United States through automatic kiosks at select airports.






STRONG: License to Carry a Firearm

A firearms license is a license or permit issued by a government authority that allows the licensee to buy, own, possess, or carry a firearm.





STRONG: NEXUS

The NEXUS card is for Canadians and Americans and provides benefits of expedited customs clearance and airport security screening.





STRONG: US Passport / Passport Card

A passport is used to verify one's country of citizenship. If traveling outside your country, it is used to regain entry into your country of citizenship. The United States passport card is an official identity and limited travel document issued by the United States federal government in the size of a credit card. It may be used as an identity card for purposes other than international travel, such as domestic air travel.




FAIR: Board of Elections Card

A Board of Elections card can be used to prove identity of a voter in government elections.

FAIR: Certified Birth Certificate

A birth certificate is required for Social Security, Medicaid, school enrollment, driver's license, social services such as a marriage license, and more. In addition, it serves as proof of relationship to parents, which is required for child support services, inheritance, and eligibility for benefits.



FAIR: Certification of Report of Birth (Form DS-1350)


The Department of State issues a DS-1350 to U.S. citizens in the U.S. who were born outside the U.S. and acquired U.S. citizenship at birth, based on the information shown on the FS-240. When the birth was recorded as a Consular Report of Birth (FS-240), certified copies of the Certification of Report of Birth Abroad (DS-1350) can be issued by the Department of State in Washington, D.C. The DS-1350 contains the same information as that on the current version of Consular Report of Birth FS-240. The DS-1350 is not issued outside the U.S.



FAIR: Common Access Card

The Common Access Card (CAC), a "smart" card about the size of a credit card, is the standard identification for active-duty uniformed Service personnel, Selected Reserve, Department of Defense (DoD) civilian employees, and eligible contractor personnel.





FAIR: Employee ID

Employee IDs are only acceptable if they have a photograph and a unique identifying number.



FAIR: Federal, State, or Local Government Issued ID

Varies by ID type. Government Issued IDs are only acceptable if they have a photograph and a unique identifying number.

FAIR: Financial Account (Bank Statement or Credit Card)

A bank account or credit card and associated statement is issued to an individual by a financial institution






FAIR: Health Insurance Card

Your insurance card proves that you have health insurance. It contains information that your doctor or hospital will use to get paid by your insurance company.



FAIR: Identification Card for US Citizen in the US (Form I-179)

Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS) issued Forms I-179 to U.S. citizens who are residents of the United States. This card does not contain an expiration date, and is valid indefinitely.



FAIR: Military Dependent's ID Card

Varies by ID type. Government Issued IDs are only acceptable if they have a photograph and a unique identifying number.

FAIR: Native American Tribal Document

A Native American tribal document establishes both identity and employment authorization on Form I-9 under Lists B and C. To be acceptable for Form I-9 purposes, a tribe recognized by the U.S. federal government must issue the Native American tribal document.





FAIR: Pay Stub

A pay stub, also known as a check stub, is the part of a paycheck or a separate document that lists details about the employee's pay.

FAIR: Permanent Resident Card or Alien Registration Receipt Card (Green Card)


A green card allows a non-U.S. citizen to live and work lawfully anywhere in the United States and qualify for U.S. citizenship after three or five years.






FAIR: Personal Identification Verification (PIV) Card

A Personal Identity Verification (PIV) credential is a US Federal governmentwide credential used to access Federally controlled facilities and information systems at the appropriate security level.





FAIR: School ID Card

School IDs are only acceptable if they have a photograph and a unique identifying number.






FAIR: Social Security Card

The Social Security Card helps identify and accurately record your covered wages or self-employment earnings.



FAIR: US Citizen ID Card

The former Immigration and Naturalization Service issued Form I-197 to naturalized U.S. citizens.



FAIR: Utility Bill

A utility bill (gas, water, electricity, landline phone, internet or cable bills are acceptable), no older than three months.
