Workflow pilot study published in *Information Systems Frontiers*

A recent study conducted by HEALTHeLINK in cooperation with a researcher at University of Connecticut and Brookings Institute's Center for Technology Innovation, demonstrates that provider offices effectively utilizing health information exchange (HIE) technology can help save their patients and the greater health care community both time and money. The results of the study of integrating HIE into workflow practice were published in the [January 2020 Information Systems Frontiers](#).

The study examined whether integration of HIE services into medical practices' workflow would have an impact on emergency department (ED) visits and unplanned 30-day readmission amongst patients who were treated at the practice. When practices were trained on how to efficiently utilize and integrate the HIE into their daily workflow, the pilot concluded that the rate of **unplanned hospital readmissions was reduced 10.2% and the rate of ED visits was reduced 13.3%**.

Migration to computer generated consent forms

To improve efficiencies for your practice, the patient, and HEALTHeLINK, we are moving to computer generated forms exclusively. The MI004-1 consent form type will become obsolete mid-year and any hand printed consent forms received after that will be deemed invalid. Please contact your account manager to schedule training to convert you to our Consent Management Application, or discuss other consent options. With this functionality, you will know real-time whether a patient has already signed a HEALTHeLINK consent form. It also enables immediate update of a patient's consent status once the system generated consent form is signed by the patient.

Windows 7 update



As of January 14, Microsoft has discontinued support for Windows 7, which means that the machines running the operating system will no longer receive technical support, software updates, or security patches. If you are using a Windows 7 machine, please encourage your IT team to upgrade

to a stable operating system as soon as possible. While Microsoft is offering extended support to those who pay, it is a fallback for those who need extended time to transition to a stable operating system. Since HEALTHeLINK is not able to identify which Windows 7 machines are receiving extended support, we will be blocking access to the HEALTHeCOMMUNITY Portal and its associated applications from Windows 7 machines. We are coordinating with participants to understand the timeline for removing Windows 7 access, but plan on blocking access within the next 3 to 6 months.
